



## CLUE #1 – GATHER YOUR SUPPLIES

- Solid color cardstock, 7 x 6-3/4”
  - Scored on the 7” side at 1/2, 1, 3-3/4, and 4-1/4”
  - Rotate quarter turn to the right and score on the 6-3/4” side at 1/2, 4-1/2 and 5”
- Designer Series Paper, 2-5/8 x 1-5/8”
- Designer Series Paper, 2-5/8 x 3-7/8”
- Solid color cardstock for die cuts and layers
- Solid color cardstock scraps for stamping and cutting images
- Ink pads to coordinate with your designer series paper
- Stamps and punches or dies
- An embossing folder
- Ribbon of your choice to wrap around the box



## **CLUE #2 – Burnish, Trim, Designer Series Paper**

- Run a bone folder over all the scores in your 7 x 6-3/4” piece.
- Trim according to the template, see the video or project sheet. Round the corners on the tab if you like. I will do one with you!
- Adhere the designer series paper to the front panel and front tab. Use care on the tab if you have directional pattern designer series paper.



## **CLUE #3 – Cut a Notch and Assemble**

- Use the centering ruler on the SU! Grid Paper to mark center of the front panel. Punch a notch for easy treat removal.
- Add Tear & Tape Adhesive to the side glue tab, on the outside, and to the bottom front panel flap, on the inside.
- Remove adhesive liner and assemble the treat box.
- Any guesses what common chocolate candy fits?



## **CLUE #4 – Wrap and Tie a Bow**

- Wrap a length of ribbon around the box. Placement is important, make sure it doesn't interfere with the top tab. Tie the bow to the far left or right side.
- I love big bows on gift boxes, especially bows that don't have to be untied to access the treat then retied to close the box.



## **CLUE #5 – Stamp, Cut and Layer Focal Image**

- Stamp your focal image and cut or punch.
- Stamp any sentiments at this time too.
- Layer the image on to the solid color die cuts. I used the embossing folder in clue #1 to emboss one of my layers.
- Embellish with smaller die cut or stamped and cut images.



## **CLUE #6 – Use Dimensionals to Close the Box**

- Fold the box closed and put dimensionals on front of the box below the tab. Don't seal the box closed with these dimensionals.
- Add some dimensionals to the bottom edge of the stack of labels.
- Adhere the stack of labels to the box as a closure.



## **CLUE #7 – Mystery Solved!**

- Does your box look like mine?
